**NEXT SECTION OF RECYCLED WATER PIPELINE CONSTRUCTION TO
START IN JULY**

Starting the week of July 25, work will begin on additional sections of the Groundwater Recovery Enhancement and Treatment (GREAT) Program's recycled water pipeline. Construction of the pipeline will run along Channel Islands Boulevard from Ventura Road to C Street, where it will head south to Pleasant Valley Road. The pipeline construction will continue west on Pleasant Valley Road and then south along Perkins Road to the Advanced Water Purification Facility on Hueneme Road. It is anticipated that work will be completed by late 2011.

Motorists are asked to be mindful of traffic controls in construction areas and "Slow for the Cone Zone". Through traffic will be open in both directions. There will be short periods during which lanes may be shut down to allow for the movement of construction materials, vehicles and personnel. Construction activities may impact on-street parking. "No Parking" signs will be posted as necessary.

The bulk of the construction will take place Monday through Friday between 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. There will also be some weekend, evening and night work which will allow construction work to be expedited, minimizing the duration of traffic impacts. Noise level restrictions will be in place. All dates, hours and locations are subject to change.

The City will provide advance notification to the community regarding lane closures, potential delays and evening, night and weekend work. Signs will be posted and information will be available through the local newspapers, radio stations, "City Watch TV" on Time Warner Channel 10, Verizon FiOS Channel 35, and on the web at OxnardNews.org.
