## Responses

<u>Conclusion C-01</u>: The Grand Jury concluded that among the County law enforcement facilities that have drug disposal bins, there is a lack of information and consistency in public guidance regarding disposal of all medications, particularly for pet owners.

**Response to C-01**: The City of Simi Valley does not contest the Grand Jury's Conclusion C-01. Please refer to the response to Recommendation R-03.

Recommendation R-03: The Grand Jury recommends that all law enforcement agencies update their websites and other sources of public information. Information should include, but not be limited to guidance regarding the availability of disposal bins for drugs and sharps, accessibility requirements to the bins and directions for disposal.

Response to R-03: Staff located a discrepancy on the City's website and updated the information with instructions on how to make an appointment for disposal. Additionally, information on what types of medications (including pet medications) are accepted, how to prepare medications for deposit, and locations that accept sharps for disposal can be found on the City's website.
