### *RAIN Transitional Living Center*

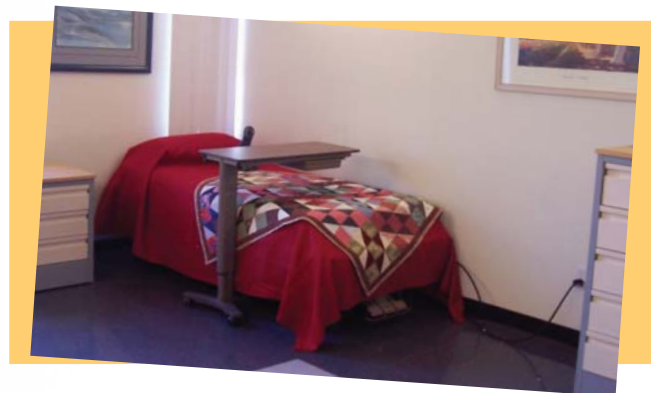
When your physician decides you are ready to leave the hospital, but you need a safe and healthy place to continue your recovery, RAIN may be just right for you.

## Things to know

- Respite care at RAIN is offered free of charge to persons who are homeless.
- The average length of respite stay is 30 days, but may be extended.
- Respite candidates should be ambulatory and capable of attending to their needs, such as bathing, dressing and eating.
- RAIN residents must remain drug and alcohol free while staying at RAIN.
- No pets are allowed at RAIN, but we will help make arrangements for pet care.

## What RAIN offers

- Caring communal atmosphere
- Three healthy meals each day
- Transportation to and from medical appointments
- Medication distribution
- Laundry facility
- On-site social worker to assist with linking to services, benefits, and locating housing

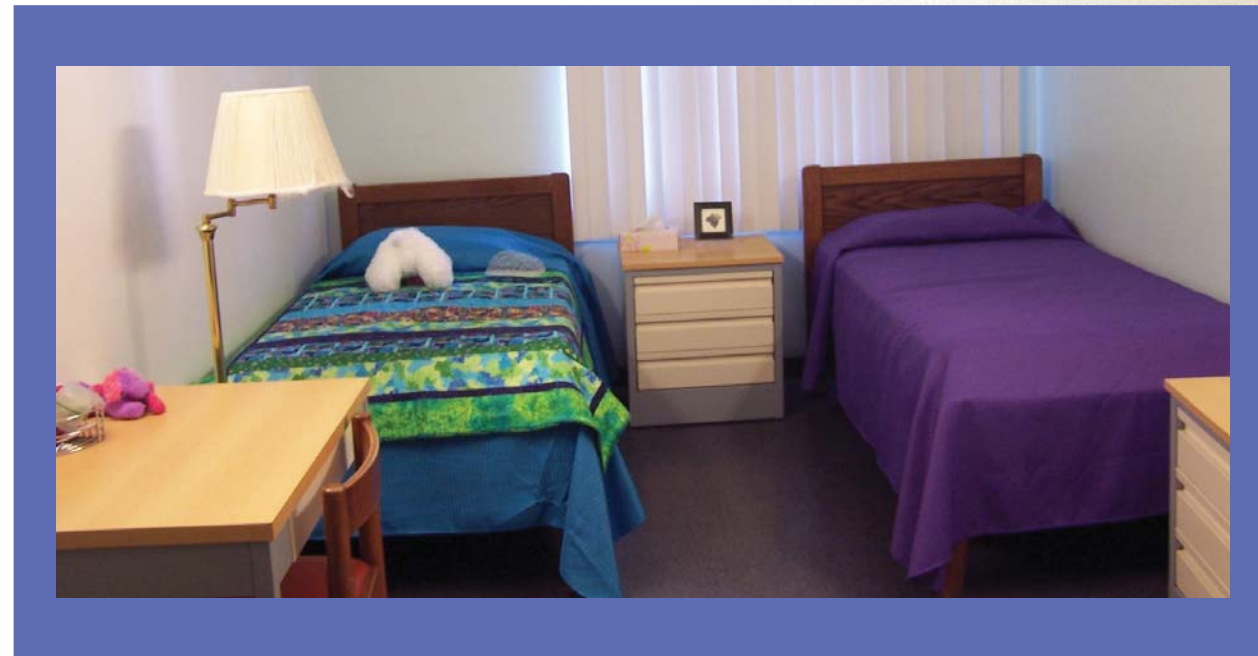


If, after a hospital stay, a safe and healthy space is needed to continue recovering, RAIN may be just the right place.

## How to apply

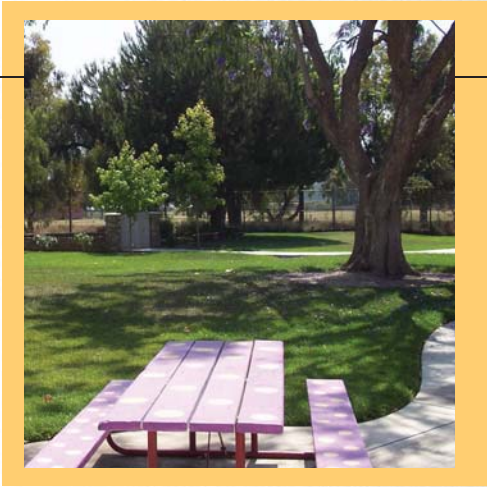
- Talk to your doctor, nurse, or the hospital social services staff about needing a place to recover. The hospital social services staff will help you fill out the application and determine eligibility.
- If your application is approved, Ventura County Public Health will send a nurse to talk with you and evaluate your medical needs.
- A social worker from the Homeless Services Program will meet with you to assess your needs and answer your questions about RAIN.
- Upon approval, arrangements will be made for your transportation to RAIN, along with the paperwork, durable medical equipment, and medications.

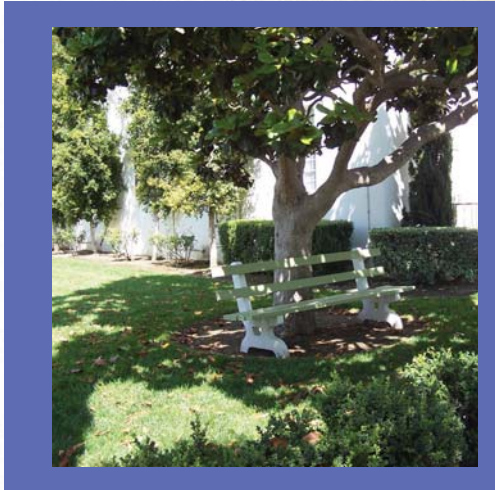
