V.	Chair Announcements		
	 Co-chair Borchard mentioned that the Behavioral Health Advisory Board is scheduled to conduct site visits. In this regard, BHAB is requesting recommendations from the Adult Committee possible sites to visit looking at the perspective of adult prerequisites. This was discussed later during the meeting. Co-chair Karyn Bates mentioned about an editorial article featured in Ventura STAR expressing a passionate perspective in favor of ending homelessness. She indicated that submitting write-ups is one way of increasing awareness on the need to address homelessness. She encouraged the Committee to continue its participation in various engagements on this issue. Co-chair Bates also shared the article written by Kathleen Wilson on April 6 entitled "County names new crisis center." The Ventura Board of Supervisors approved naming the center after David Holmboe, a mental health leader and retired educator who died last year. The county-owned six-bed center located at 2130 N. Ventura Road is due to open in August 2016.

VII.	 Time Certain: Presentation, Kiran Sahota, VCBH MHSA Manager Ms. Sahota provided a thorough overview on the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and update on ongoing initiatives. Ms. Sahota noted that MHSA is centrally focused on Community Support Services (CSS) which receives 80% of MHSA funds. Prevention Early Intervention (PEI) receives 20% of MHSA funds and Innovations (INN) receives 5% of PEI funds. Ms. Sahota recently attended the California Behavioral Health Directors Association (CBHDA) meeting last Monday, April 4. The meeting components included discussions on PEI and Innovation Regulations, MHSA Policy Issues, housing updates including CSS Housing Regulations, MHSOAC updates on evaluation projects, fiscal transparency, etc. 		
	3. The Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) will meet on April 14 to identify and document key barriers and some solutions to implementing the PEI and Innovation regulations demographic reporting requirements. MHSOAC was formed to work with CBHDA, counties, mental health providers, and stakeholders on operationalizing the regulations of demographic reporting, program and measurement requirements, and measurement of duration of untreated mental illness.		
	 The Board of Directors of California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA) will hold its Strategic Planning Session and Regular Board Meeting on April 15, 2016. Ms. Sahota mentioned that initiatives of MHSA include: partnering with Ventura County Law Enforcement; providing Mental Health First Aid (MHFA); Rainbow Umbrella, a group structured to provide support to the LGBT community; Positive Behavior Intervention & Support (PBIS); Positive Parenting Program (Triple P), City Impact, Interface; Primary Care Program (PCP); SafeTALK, etc. 		
	 MHSA recently organized a Suicide Prevention Forum & Mental Wellness Fair last month at Fillmore. The event provided information about local resources for mental health and wellness. Ventura County Suicide Prevention Council members were invited to address questions. Ms. Sahota mentioned that as part of its prevention initiatives, MHSA created and designed the Preventing Suicide Help & Hope flyer as a resource on suicide prevention. 	3.	Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU)		
		a) The Board of Supervisor recently approved and designated the		
		Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) as a treatment and evaluation facility		
		for minors. The facility is located at 2130 N. Ventura Road, Oxnard.		
		VBCH entered into an agreement with Seneca Family of Agencies to operate the CSU. The facility will provide evaluation and treatment		
		services to mentally unstable minors. It is expected that a good		
		number of staff applicants will be bi-lingual which is important to the		
		department. Treatment through the CSU is limited to less than 23		
		hours and 59 minutes. Within that period, clients will either transfer to		
		an LPS facility for further treatment, step down to Short Term		
		Residential, or return home with aftercare services in place. It is anticipated that CSU will provide stabilization and hospitalization to a		
		significant number of children in Ventura County. It is also expected		
		that hospitalizations will be dramatically reduced by as much as		
		50%. Mr. Mendoza expressed that this is a reaffirmation of the		
		department's commitment to provide critical services to children		
		experiencing a mental health crisis.		
		b) Meeting with stakeholders will be arranged soon. Liz Warren		
		suggested including consumers during stakeholders meeting. The suggestion was well taken.		
		c) CSU is scheduled to open in August 2016.

Alcohol and Drug Update – Anna Flores, ADP Manager The Behavioral Health Department is in process of restructuring a Drug Medi-Cal organized delivery system. The draft of the waiver pilot project is under revision and anticipated to be submitted as soon as finalized.
