	modeled after the Portland Identification and Early Referral	
	(PIER) model funded through the Mental Health Services Act	
	(MHSA) serving young people ages 16-25 at risk of	
	developing psychosis.	
2	2. VIPS is a partnership with Telecare Corp offered by Ventura	
	County Behavioral Health.	
3	3. He highlighted that VIPS is a treatment program designed to	
	educate (a) the community about severe mental illness and	
	early signs of psychosis; (b) provide treatment to young	
	people and their families to allow progression of several	
	mental illness; and (c) reduce the stigma around severe	
	mental illness and offer hope for the future.
