IV.	Welcome and Introductions The Chair welcomed everyone and asked for introductions.		
V.	 Chair Announcement Chair Nielsen announced that Carol Thomas will Co-Chair the BHAB TAY Committee starting November 2016. Chair Nielsen reminded all that NAMI Walk is on Saturday. April 30, 2015 at Ventura Beach Promenade. He encouraged Committee to participate.

VII.	Presentation – Time Certain: 10:30 am Leticia Woodruff, THP+FC Program Supervisor 1. Ms. Woodruff made a brief overview on the nature and description of their organization and the Aspiranet Transitional Housing Program Plus foster Care (THP+FC).		

She mentioned that they are committed to strengthening and empowering communities throughout their network. 2. Ms. Woodruff gave a thorough discussion on the scope and nature of their services. They are serving youth who are younger than 21. Ms. Woodruff emphasized that their program is to provide support to foster youth in the transition to independence. 3. Ms. Woodruff mentioned that Aspiranet THP+FC is available in various locations and continues to expand into new areas across the state. 4. She gave a comprehensive discussion on the different services they provide to the TAY population including a. Transportation assistance b. Roommates: selection and support c. Public Benefit Advocacy d. Regular Housing Advocacy and Tenancy Training e. Training Curriculum to Prepare Youth for Housing f. Moving Assistance g. Ongoing Life Skills Training h. Security Deposit Assistance Ms. Woodruff explained that the THP+FC program provides participating youth with option to live with host family depending on program location or in an apartment with roommates. The program provides supportive services to participating TAY individuals. Ms. Sharon Espinosa of the Dept. of Rehab noted that they can provide assistance to participants who have disability barriers in work-related environment. Benjamin Valdes of Pacific Clinics TAY Tunnel mentioned that Aspiranet can refer participants to their program since they also offer cost-effective treatment, program development, trainings, and supportive programs to the TAY population. Discussion Transition Independent Process (TIP) System -VIII. McKian Nielsen 1. Chair Nielsen mentioned that during the last Committee meeting, Mr. Joseph Solomita, Managing Director, Stars Training Academy, was invited to present and talk about the Stars Training Academy. Mr. Solomita discussed the different TIP model domain namely: employment, educational opportunity, personal effectiveness and wellbeing, and living situation. 2. Based on the TIP model implementation process presented by Mr. Solomita, Mr. Nielsen asked the members present if they want to invite again Mr. Solomita or his designate to come to the meeting and make an in-depth discussion on the implementation process of the TIP model. 3. It was suggested that it would be beneficial to hear from the other counties that have been trained and have implemented the TIP model in their counties. One of the examples cited Invite Casa Joseph was the County of Santa Barbara. 4. Joseph Lopez of Casa Pacific mentioned that they have Pacifica to Lopez/McKian completed the training on the TIP model. In this regard, the Nielsen present in future Committee proposed inviting representative(s) from Casa meeting Pacifica to present to the Committee and discuss outcomes

and measures.

Santa Paula and Fillmore juvenile case load is bigger than anticipated; half of adolescent clients are over 18. Their Prevention Program has is an ongoing campaign on Weed DUI. The Committee suggested inviting Dan Hicks or David Tovar in future meetings to present more about the campaign. X.	 Providers' Update Department of Rehab, Sharon Espinosa – Lisa Brunelle is the new Supervisor in Oxnard. Ms. Brunelle is bilingual and she has been with the department for 20 years. Casa Pacifica, Josh Lopez – There are 30 individuals utilizing their services throughout the county. Last year they started with an average of 14-15 individuals; end of fiscal year shows an average of 26 individuals. One of their challenges is running their groups to be relevant. Their programs are more experiential and didactic. TAY Tunnel, Benjamin Valdes – Robert Chavez is the new Employment Specialist. They have started the Career Cub. Open enrollment is every Wednesday.
