Child Abduction CODE PURPLE	A child aged 1 – 12 is missing or is known to have been kidnapped.	Go to closest exit, watch for anyone exhibiting unusual behavior.	Verify child's identity (wrist name tag). Get description of adult, direction of travel.	Immediately report information on suspect to Security and Nursing Supervisor.
Security Situation CODE GRAY	Any escalating or potentially violent behavior.	Clear the area to avoid others becoming involved.	Report incident information to Security and Supervisor.	Complete report of incident.
Weapon or Hostage Situation CODE SILVER	A person is brandishing a weapon and/or has taken hostage(s) within the hospital or its property.	Call 911 immediately, then call Security: VCMC Campus Dial 7-6666 SPH Campus Dial 7-8666 Then Notify Paging (#76075)	Close the immediate area and initiate hospital lockdown. Seek cover/protection and warn others.	Assess and complete report of incident.
Hazardous Material Spill or Release CODE ORANGE	Incidental Spill: Small spill presenting NO hazard to trained staff or environment.  Emergency/Major Spill:	Trainer/User clean up spill. Use appropriate protective equipment/decontamination materials.	Appropriately dispose of materials.	Complete report of incident.

Rapid Response (VCMC/SPH)	Deteriorating patient status or failure to respond to treatment. Earthquake	Significant shaking of building.	Duck and Cover. Protect self/head, get under table, away from objects like to fall.	Triage yourself, survey damage, take appropriate defensive action.	Report damage/problems to Department Supervisor.
Evacuation CODE ZERO	Remaining in area may be hazardous to life, health or safety.	Administrator will notify all in area of need to evacuate. Evacuate ambulatory, wheelchair, then bed ridden; records if safety permits.	Report to designated assembly area and account for all persons who were in previous area.	Report evacuation status to Supervisor. Identify any missing personnel.
