

Basic Needs

iFoster Online Resource Portal

Foster youth, foster families, relative caregivers, and professionals working with any of those groups can access local resources and retail discounts. Resources also include free online tutoring, free cell phones, discounted laptop computers, and discounted orthodontics. Upon registration, participants will be asked to provide the name of someone who can verify their status as a foster youth, parent, or relative caregivers. James Store House

James Store House secures donations for foster and birth parents and youth in care. Items include furniture, clothing, and other material necessities. Heart-to-Heart

Cornerstone Clothing Closet

Rachael's Closet

Rachael's Closet is a resource closet run by VCFPA and provides new and used clothing, shoes, backpacks, bedding, infant and toddler supplies, and toys to foster families in Ventura County through a central physical location in the City of Ventura. Extracurricular Activities

Children's Services Auxiliary

The CSA partners with CFS to provide a range of financial supports to foster youth and their families. Families can apply for reimbursements for extracurricular activities, summer camps, computers, clothing, and scholarships. Reimbursements can take up to 60 days to be processed. The CSA also hosts the Holiday Toy Store and events throughout the year. Families or social workers should contact Elisa Carreno at 289-1926 BEFORE enrolling in an activity to ensure that it can be funded based on the CSA guidelines.

HOPE4Kids

Hope4Kids in a non-profit that provides funding for extra-curricular, and enrichment activities, and other needs that may not be met through our other resource partners. **Families or social workers should contact Elisa Carreno at 289-1926 to determine eligibility.**

Respite Care

Channel Islands Social Services

Foster parents and relative caregivers are eligible for up to 12 hours of FREE respite care each month. Families caring for children ages 9 or under, or a child with special needs, are automatically eligible and can contact <u>Channel Islands Social Services</u> directly at (805) 384-0983 to register. If the family is caring for children over 9 or requires more than 12 hours, social workers can make the referral directly to CISS (see attached exception form) and CC <u>Angelina.mccormick-soll@ventura.org</u>. These cases will be reviewed for need, natural support system, and plan for when the short term exception ends.

Child Care/Child Development

Child Development Resources

<u>Child Development Resources</u> administers a range of childcare programs and provides referrals to community child care providers. Foster children may receive priority assignment from the wait list and subsidies with verification from their social worker that the child is a court dependent minor. In order to apply, foster parents should complete the following steps:

1. Complete the Centralized Eligibility List Application, which can be downloaded here: https://www.childdevelopmentresources.org/TextPages/how_do_i_enroll.aspx



- 2. Provide the completed application to Elisa Carreno at elisa.carreno@ventura.org or fax to 654-3454. She will verify the child is a dependent minor and will submit the application packet, with the verification, to CDR directly.
- 3. Elisa will follow up with caregivers to confirm the application has been submitted and provide them the CDR contact information so that you are able to check the status of the application.

Easter Seals

The Easter Seals Child Development Center serves children ages 2-5. Foster children typically qualify for very low or no cost services. Preschool scheduling is dependent on the family's work or school schedule and will be determined at the time of application. Child Development Centers

Child Development Inc. operates early care and education that serve children birth through twelve years of age. They offer a variety of infant, preschool and school age programs. They work with school districts to provide before and after school programs, including homework assistance and kindergarten readiness programs to families. CDC also provides preschool programs in Oxnard, Fillmore, Ventura, Thousand Oaks, & Port Hueneme. Foster children are often eligible for priority assignment into a program and subsidized care. Education

Foster Youth Services Program: FYS works in collaboration with foster Liaisons in each district in the county to ensure that the educational, physical, social and emotional needs of foster youth are identified, to determine gaps in educational and social support services and provide those services, directly or through referrals to collaborative partners. The program also seeks to facilitate the completion and timely transfer of school records, improve students' academic achievement, reduce truancy, dropout rates and delinquent behavior, and provide advocacy to promote the best interest of foster youths throughout the county. In-home Support & Contract Programs

In-home Placement Training (IPT& KIPT): This program is required for newly licensed foster parents or approved relative caregivers to receive 8 hours of additional training in trauma, attachment, working with birth families, and self-care. Families are automatically referred after obtaining their license or receive a relative placement. Contact Melana 805-643-1446 Ext. 116.

Support & Education Program (SET): In home services for foster parents or relative caregivers who have children with trauma histories in their homes, are struggling with behavioral challenges, or need support and training in connecting with the child.
