Hangar / Tie Down Rent

As the County's new fiscal year approaches, it is once again time to review the rental rates for hangars and tie downs. Policy, as set by the Board of Super-



visors, calls for rates that recapture total costs. This is accomplished (per the policy) by performing a cost recovery analysis every five years, and adjustments calculated by applying the Consumer Price Index (CPI) every other year. This year rates are due for a CPI adjustment. The CPI for this period will increase the rental rates for hangars and tie

downs by 7.59%. This new rate will be effective July 1, 2008. If you have automatic payments set up with your financial institution, please update the amount prior to your July payment. New payment coupon books will be mailed to all tenants with the new rate. Please contact the Airport Manager at the number listed on the reverse side with any questions.

After Hours Flying



The Air Traffic Control Towers at Camarillo and Oxnard Airports currently operate between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. During non-tower hours taxiing aircraft can sometimes be difficult to see. Before taxiing please make radio announcements to let other traffic on the ground know of your intentions. It is helpful not only to other pilots who may also be taxiing somewhere on the airport, but also useful information for Operations Officers and maintenance personnel who are driving around the airport conducting business and or sweeping runways and taxiways.

Many of the airport operations that lead to safe skies – such as airplane fueling and washing, aircraft and ground vehicle maintenance – result in byproducts that must be disposed of carefully. Oil, fuel, hazardous chemicals, battery disposal, and even wash water can be a problem if stormwater management and pollution reducing practices aren't followed. To help us remember that only rain can go down the drain, the drain inlets on the airport will soon be marked with a colorful marker, like the one depicted here.

How Can You Help?

It takes every member of the airport community to make Clean Water and Safe Skies a reality. You can help us to be good stewards of the environment by using the following tips to prevent pollution:


- Properly dispose of hazardous waste, used oil, and batteries.
- Wash your aircraft at the wash rack, or use best management practices by washing in appropriate locations away from storm drains, using minimal water via pressure washer, and sweeping up any residue after the water evaporates.
- Keep trash, dirt and debris off the airport ramps and out of storm drains.
- Report sheens, foams and other evidence of illicit discharges to airport operations.
