## Welcome to the District One Newsletter

On November 2nd the County held our 150th anniversary and State of the County event at the beautiful Reagan Presidential Library. It was an honor to join County CEO Dr. Sevet Johnson in providing remarks to a sold-out room.

Our presentation touched on the future of the County of Ventura and the current strategic priorities of the Board of Supervisors. Some of the highlights include:

- The County is fiscally healthy, has strong financial reserves and our retirement system is 97% funded (among the highest in the State).
- We are the safest large county in California, and we are continuing to invest in our public safety departments.
- Ventura County is ranked high in innovation and has diverse industries creating quality, high-paying jobs.
- We are prioritizing economic development initiatives to foster more business growth and job expansion.
- Despite the hard work of so many, homelessness continues to be a challenge and we are focused on new initiatives to house these individuals and provide necessary services, clean up encampments, and reduce vagrancy.
- Fentanyl is creating devastating impacts in Ventura County and we are working closely with law enforcement, education leaders, public health, and behavioral health to address it. We are also about to launch the first inpatient medical detox program in the entire county at VCMC.

# **District 1 Updates**

#### Ventura County Receives Critical Funding to Address Public Safety Issues

The Board of Supervisors is committed to keeping Ventura County the safest large county in California. Through our strong partnerships with District Attorney Erik Nasarenko and Sheriff Jim Fryhoff, the County recently received the following funding to address critical public safety issues:

- \$18 million to fund 11 new positions in the District Attorney's and Sheriff's office to investigate, prosecute and prevent organized retail thefts.
- \$2.5 million (in addition to the \$2.5 million we already received) to support our Ventura County Sexual Assault Kit Initiative. The funding will help us reduce the backlog of untested sexual assault kits and re-test old kits using the latest technology. This will help us arrest and prosecute the perpetrators of these awful crimes.
- \$385,000 to hire a fixed-term forensic scientist, thereby reducing the number of items awaiting analysis. This will ultimately help us solve crimes and thereby help to increase public safety. The objective is to decrease the backlog and the turnaround time for processing, recording, screening, and analyzing controlled substance evidence. This is especially helpful as we are fully committed to prosecuting those bringing and selling fentanyl in Ventura County.







#### Fallen Firefighters Remembered at Ventura County Government Center Memorial

The County hosted the annual Fallen Firefighter Memorial remembrance on November 14th. This ceremony remembers and recognizes all firefighters who died in the line of duty, whether from traumatic injury or job-related illness.

The memorial represents all seven fire agencies serving the County, including Ventura County, Oxnard City, Ventura City, Federal Fire, Fillmore City, CAL FIRE, and the U.S. Forest Service. Unveiled in 2004, the Ventura County Fallen Firefighter Memorial features a 7-foot granite statue and memorial wall on which the names of fallen firefighters are engraved.

There are now 52 names engraved on the Fallen Firefighters Memorial at the Government Center in Ventura. This year's ceremony was especially difficult for me as we remembered City of Ventura Firefighter Matthew Clapsaddle, and added his name to the roll call of the fallen.

Matt passed away on August 20, 2022, and served the Ventura City Fire Department for 28 years. Matt was beloved by everyone who knew him and I was honored to share a few words at the ceremony about his dedication and honorable service to the residents of Ventura County.
