PUBLIC COMMENT

Public comment is the opportunity for members of the public to participate in meetings by addressing the Oak Park Municipal Advisory Council in connection with one or more agenda or non-agenda items. Public comments by a member of the public at a single meeting are limited to a cumulative total of five minutes at such meeting unless the time allotment is increased or decreased by the Chair depending on the number of speakers. The public comment period during the opening part of the meeting to address non-agenda items is limited to 30 minutes total for all speakers; this 30-minute limit does not apply to items on the agenda.

To maintain a public meeting environment conductive and welcoming to receiving public comments from all members of the public, the audience is discouraged from engaging in displays of support or opposition to staff reports or public comments, including clapping, yelling, booing, hissing or cheering, that may create a disruptive environment for members of the public wishing to participate. Any person who disrupts or impedes the orderly conduct of a meeting will be instructed to cease the disruptive conduct. Failure to do so may result in that person being removed from the meeting.

Members of the public who would like to augment their comments with visual or audio presentations must submit their materials to the dale.thomas@ventura.org for review at least 48 hours before the meeting. The review will be conducted to determine only whether the materials are on matters within the jurisdiction of the Municipal Advisory Council, would be disruptive of the meeting, or would foster illegality, such as identity

theft. If it is determined that materials are about matters not within the Municipal Advisory Council's jurisdiction, or would be disruptive of the meeting, or would foster illegality, use of County-provided equipment will not be allowed.

If you wish to make a comment on a specific agenda item by email or mail, please submit your comment by 12:00 p.m. on the day prior to the meeting. Indicate in the Subject Line the Agenda item number (e.g., Item No. 9) on which you are commenting. Your email or written comment will be distributed to the Municipal Advisory Council and placed into the item's record for the minutes of the meeting. Public Comments submitted in writing are public records and subject to disclosure. An unredacted version is made available when records are requested by a Public Records Act request. 11. California Highway Patrol (CHP)

- The California Highway Patrol will be conducting a Maximum Enforcement Period (MEP) over the Independence Day weekend. The MEP will run from Friday, June 30th through Tuesday, July 4th. A focus for this MEP will be speed violations.

12. Ventura County Fire Department

- Peak fire season starts at the end of June based on moisture measurements in vegetation. Inspections have started for enforcement.
- VCFD will be prepared for wildfires with three hand crews, the aviation unit, and a CH-47 helitanker that can drop up to 3,000 gallons of water at once

13. SoCal Gas Announcement

Construction on northbound Kanan Road at Smoke Tree Avenue starting Monday 6/26. One lane is to remain open to traffic during the daytime construction, which is anticipated to last approximately 6 weeks. (See attachment)

14. Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District- Wildfire Abatement

Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District Planning Committee will be discussing if the District Board of Directors should approve and direct staff to undertake in July-August 2023 wildland fire abatement program within the County of Ventura's 100-ft wildfire hazard abatement zone, within Medea Creek Park south of the Oak Park High School and between Oak Hills Drive and Kanan Road as shown on the map attachment.

15. Change in Process: Public Works Requests

Public Works charges the Oak Park CSA#4 budget every time there is a resident request. In order to improve resident request handling and to reduce costs to the CSA#4 budget, residents are requested to use the Public Works app for all requests and to contact Supervisor Gorell's office if there are emergent concerns.

16. County Service Area 4 - Landscaping Request Approved

The Supervisor's Office has approved the request from the MAC for landscaping improvements to correct the issues of run-off on the slopes on Golden Eagle as well as improvements on Hawthorne sections "F" and "H" along the NE side of Hawthorne between Bowfield and Rockfield per the proposals submitted at the Oak Park MAC meeting of May 30. Enhanced Landscape has been advised and the work will begin in mid-July.

17.County Service Area 4 - Landscaping Issue

A request from Sheri Cohen for assistance with a gopher infestation on a county easement was received on June 12, 2023, which was affecting her home at 867 Sterling Court. A landscaping inspection took place on June 21, 2023, and was attended by Enhanced Landscaping and staff members from Public Works and Supervisor Gorell's office. Enhanced Landscaping will address this issue with the assistance of a pest control company the week of June 26, 2023

18. County Service Area 4 – License Plate Readers

Flock Safety Systems has provided a quotation for the installation of 3 license plate—readers (see attached). The quote is for a 2-year agreement. The quote is based on the recommendation of Deputy Chris Jones that 3 cameras would be needed to cover all entry points to Oak Park. The total for a 2-year contract comes to \$18,950. Budget review will determine further action.

19. Watershed Management Program

David Laak, the Stormwater Resources Manager with Ventura County Public Works Agency – Watershed Protection (VCPWA-WP), requested on April 27 that a WMP development update presentation be added as an agenda item to the May 25th Oak Park MAC meeting. On May 19 he requested that the presentation be postponed to a later date. On June 21, 2023 we were informed that this presentation was no longer needed.
