Link Between SES and Health Status


- Socioeconomic status means one's education, income, housing, employment status, etc.
- People with lower SES tend to have worse health outcomes.
- The higher one's socioeconomic status the better health care coverage the person has; able to receive regular check ups, find doctors when needed, and pay for care if required.
- Personal habits and exposure to disease are more likely to be correlated to education and income level.



93.7% of students in Thousand Oaks graduate within 4 years compared to 63.0% in Oxnard.








Outside the Healthy Fitness Zone 5th Grade, 2010-11 versus 2012-13

43.5% of 7th graders (CA 43.9%),



Percent Overweight and Obese by Race, VC Adults





Social and Emotional Wellness

- Poor mental health was identified as a significant health problem in Ventura County Community Foundation Health Assessment
- California Health Interview Survey
 - 17.8% of adults admitted that their emotions interfered with their relationships
 - 16.4% of adults admitted to needing help for emotional/mental health problems
 - 13.7% had taken medicine in past week to address issues





Youth Substance Use


The Healthy People 2020 goal is to reduce the proportion of adolescents reporting use of alcohol or illicit drugs in the past 30 days to 16.6%.

- Meeting the goal for alcohol use 7th graders but not in 9th or 11th graders
- Meeting the goal for marijuana use 7th graders and female 9th graders, but not male 9th graders or 11th graders (male and female)





Crimes Per Day by City, 2011





Oxnard has the highest number of crimes per day, but Ventura and Ojai have the highest crime rates. Santa Paula has the highest violent crime rate.




Life Expectancy by Zip Code, 2010










Adults with Diabetes




