I was delighted to participate this year by reading 'Our Favorite Day of the Year' at Fred L. Williams elementary in Oxnard.



March was an eventful month for the Board of Supervisors. We received updates from staff on our General Plan Programs, and the status of our affordable housing projects.

On March 12, our Board voted to approve distributing \$4.7m in grant funds to support affordable housing development in Ventura County. As a part of this funding, our Board allocated \$1.8m to the Cypress Place project located in the 5th district, which will add 60 units of affordable housing in the City of Oxnard.

At our March 26th Board Meeting, staff provided an update on our County's General and Climate Action Plans. Our General Plan includes a total of 569 policies and 185 implementation plans. Although there is still work to be done for our General Plan, our county has made a great impact on the housing front, by adding 465 housing units in 2023 alone, all affordable housing. For our Climate Action Plan, our County has created a tool for the public to view our programs and the County's goals to achieve a more sustainable climate for our County.

Ventura Training Center Academy Graduation



My staff attended the Ventura Training Center Ceremony to celebrate the graduates with their friends and families. The Ventura Training Center was established in 2018 by the California Department of Correctional Rehabilitation, Cal Fire, California Conservation Corp, and the Anti-Recidivism Coalition, to offer advanced firefighter training to parolees who participated at fire camps or institutional firehouses. Since 2018, over 150 paroled people have completed training at the center and now more than half of those graduates are employed full-time with state, local, and federal firefighting agencies.


Annual Cesar Chavez March
