WFC is a non-profit healthcare provider that offers free healthcare services and health supporting programs to low-income and uninsured people in Ventura County with locations in Thousand Oaks, Oxnard, and Santa Paula. More than 200 high school students participate in a rigorous two-year program that builds excellent job skills in the health care profession by assisting volunteer medical professionals in the delivery of primary health services to over 12,000 low-income uninsured residents annually in Ventura County.

When addressing the group, on-coming Commander Santiago said, "My intent over the coming years is easy, continue our journey towards building the most-ready Naval Construction Force the Navy has ever seen. We will continue to focus on mastering our construction skills, combat readiness, and personal resiliency.

Housing Issues Forum



On July 24th, I participated in a housing issues forum hosted by Housing Opportunities Made Easier (HOME) alongside fellow elected officials from throughout the County, including city councilmembers and State Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin. As a panelist, I provided my perspective on housing as a County Supervisor and shared some highlights of the County's work to increase the stock of affordable housing units. Since 2021, the County has added more than 800 units of housing and collaborated with local cities on housing developments to help address the shortage of affordable housing.


Ventura County Crop Report

City of Ocotlan Public Safety Equipment Donation



I want to thank the Ventura County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) and the Ventura County Fire Department (VCFD) for their partnership in donating old and used equipment to public safety officials in the City of Ocotlan, Jalisco, Mexico through the Oxnard Sister City Committee. At our July 23rd Board of Supervisors meeting, I presented this recommendation to our board, which was approved unanimously. The City of Oxnard formed the 'Sister City' relationship with the City of Ocotlan in 1964, with the purpose of promoting goodwill and friendship through a program of exchanges and visitations.

During their visit to Oxnard in 2023, public safety officials from Ocotlan shared with me the dire need for equipment, as their current

equipment has long exceeded its expected useful life. My office then collaborated with both VCSO and VCFD to identify eligible used equipment for donation, which resulted in 50 radios, 24 vehicle radios, and 20 pairs of firefighting equipment including helmets, coats, boots, gloves, and uniforms that are no longer needed based on U.S. standards. These donations will provide a long-lasting benefit for Ocotlan's Public Safety Officials, residents, and visitors from our community for years to come. Ventura County Mobile Library



The Ventura County Board of Supervisors received a visit from the Ventura County Library Department's brand-new Mobile Library at our July 23rd Board meeting.

The new School Mobile Library is fully stocked with new books, a computer lab, wi-fi, and offers full accessibility.

In 2022 the County of Ventura received grant funding for the purchase of the vehicle and created a partnership with the Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) and local credit unions Premier America, CBC

Federal Credit Union, County Schools Federal Credit Union and Ventura County Credit Union were named as sponsors for ongoing funding.

This project was made possible with additional support from the VC Library Foundation, Rotary Club of Camarillo, and The Institute of Museum and Library Services. a. By working together, we are enriching the lives of Ventura County's youth.


Oxnard Fire Department Emergency Medical Services Corps
