

Regional Defense Partnership Makes Annual Washington Trip



Last month, I joined fellow Regional Defense Partnership (RDP) board members – including RDP Executive Director Gene Fisher, County Supervisor Kelly Long, and City of Port Hueneme Mayor Martha McQueen-Legohn, Sr. – for an annual trip to Washington, D.C. to meet with elected and appointed leaders regarding Ventura County's military facilities, defense contractor industry, and its impact on our regional economy.

This year's trip focused on top issues for Naval Base Ventura County (NVBC) and partners, including addressing aging infrastructure, workforce, and the resiliency of the base.

The Regional Defense Partnership – also known as RDP, is a community-based collaborative partnership of representatives bringing together local city and county elected officials and select members of the local community to advocate for the preservation and enhancement of our military facilities in Ventura County as well as to strengthen existing military and community partnerships in an effort to attract new military missions to the bases. For almost two decades NBVC has been identified as the County's largest employer. Directly and indirectly supporting thousands of jobs, they have a huge economic impact on our county.

When communities show strong support through partnerships, and local alignment with base priorities, they help ensure installations are seen as indispensable. RDP leads the effort for this in Ventura County.

County Accepts \$6.8m State Grant to Address Homelessness

Ventura County recently accepted \$6.8 million from the State of California's Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) program. Since 2020 the County of Ventura has received a total of \$23,049,530 in HHAP funds. The funds have served 3,768 Ventura County residents, with 1,448 of those residents gaining permanent supportive housing.

Criminal Justice Training Center Graduates Large Class

Local law enforcement agencies gathered at the end of March to mark the graduation of one of the largest classes ever – sixty-nine graduates - from the Ventura County Criminal Justice Training Center. Graduates of the training center were selected by and are now set to join local law enforcement agencies, including Oxnard Police Department, Ventura County Sheriff's Department and the Ventura Police Department.

Surrounded by nearly 1700 friends and family, graduates walked across the stage to receive their diplomas to cheers of "that's my brother" "that's my sister" and "that's my nino!" Congratulations to these new deputies and officers.



Ventura County Continues Support for Additional Housing

At the March 18th Board of Supervisors meeting our Board received an update on the County's Housing Element – the section of the County's General Plan that addresses the regional housing needs for the unincorporated areas of the County.

Of particular interest was an update on local efforts to meet the Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA). The state-wide RHNA process is used to plan for affordable housing needs across the state and lowmoderate-income for households. Under RHNA. the unincorporated areas of the County are expected to add 1,262 new units between 2021 and 2029. Since 2021, 1,063 new units were added, reaching 84 percent of the allocation.

The Youth Commissioners asked the panelists a broad range of questions regarding budgets, community partnerships, recruitment, and how officers manage stress. The Council and the panelists demonstrated passion for their communities by engaging in thoughtful dialogue about police department operations and how they ensure the safety of our communities.

I send my appreciation to Chief Benites, Chief Federico, and Commander Newman for meeting with our local youth leaders.

Library has New Mural and APCD Clean Air Facility Designation

As the Ray D. Prueter Library in Port Hueneme nears its grand reopening, it is also on the way to being designated a Clean Air Facility, meaning the library can be used as a place of respite during unhealthy air conditions, including during wildfires.

The designation is made by the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District (VC-APCD), who also approved the library's application for a \$200,000 grant for some of the HVAC improvements that will help the Library earn the clean air designation. An additional \$200,000 in Library funding was reallocated by the Board of Supervisors to allow for upgrades of all nine of the Library's HVAC units under one project and timeline. The community is invited to attend the grand reopening celebration of the Ray D. Prueter Library, including the addition of a beautiful new mural that will welcome patrons at the entrance. The celebration and mural reveal will be held on Saturday May 3, 2025 from 11:00am to 1:00 pm.
