Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income of the type which own or hold interests in real or personal property subject to regulation or oversight by the particular division(s) and/or program activities as to which the designated employee has responsibilities.

Category 7

Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income of the type with respect to which the particular division(s) and/or program activities as to which the designated employee has responsibilities.

Category 8

Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income which provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by the particular division(s) and/or program activities as to which the designated employee has responsibilities.
