In 2022, deputies made 7,479 stops for equipment violations and 5,825 stops for non-moving violations, according to p.27 of the report on "Racial Equity and Policing in Ventura County" attached to the 2/1/2024 Agenda. This is an important and sensitive finding.

Some of these 13,000 stops were immediate safety issues and needed a stop, such as both headlights out or both brake lights out. Others could have been handled by mailing a ticket, like expired tags, or one tail light out. Some stops revealed other crimes. The public needs to know, for each type of violation,

- 1. How many stops were made for each type of violation
- 2. How many of the stops for that violation resulted in detecting or stopping a violent crime (like trafficking)?

If some types of stops (for equipment or non-moving violations) rarely or never lead to stopping a more dangerous crime, we need to know. They put officers and public into danger, and we need to know what types of stops these are, so we can mail tickets.

Subject: REPORT FROM COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBER APPLICATION REVIEW *AD HOC* AND CONSIDER POTENTIAL ACTION TO APPOINT ONE OF TWO ORGANIZATIONS AS THE NEW PSREAG COMMUNITY MEMBER ORGANIZATION: PROJECT50 OR GATHERING FOR JUSTICE

Summary:

The Ventura County Asian American Bar Association stepped away from PSREAG in September of 2023 and their departure created a Community Organization Member vacancy. As such, per the bylaws:

Upon a Community Organization Membership vacancy on PSREAG, the Advisory Group shall publicly notify Ventura County community-based organizations of the vacancy to solicit letters of interest. The Advisory Group shall rank the applications and vote on the top two ranked organization applications. The applicant who receives a majority of the votes will be invited to nominate a member to serve on the Advisory Group for the remaining term of the vacancy.

The Community Based Organization (CBO) Application Review Ad-Hoc Committee was appointed by PSREAG on November 9, 2023, at a special meeting of the PSREAG. PSREAG members were encouraged to notify organizations of the vacancy and begin recruiting organizations to submit letters of interest (LOI) from CBOs with an original deadline for submitting applications by November 30, 2023.

Additionally, at the November 9, 2023 special meeting of the PSREAG, an Ad Hoc Committee was formed to review and rank the LOIs and select the top two organizations to bring back to the larger group for a vote, per the bylaws. The ad hoc originally consisted of Willie Lubka (alternate for Bob Bland), Cynthia Gonzalez and Cindy Liu. This iteration of the ad hoc never met.

On November 20, 2023, and on December 20th 2023, CEO-Office of DEI provided sample email language to PSREAG members for recruiting LOI's from Community Based Organizations.

On November 30, 2023 Mr. Lubka informed CEO-Office of DEI staff that Buen Vecino, where he serves in a leadership role, submitted a LOI and he would no longer be able to participate on the related Ad Hoc due to the conflict of interest. During the December 7, 2023 regular PSREAG meeting, Genevieve Flores-Haro volunteered to replace Willie Lubka on the ad hoc sub-committee.

By the November 30, 2023 deadline, RISE Simi Valley and Buen Vecino had submitted applications. The deadline was extended to January 5, 2024. As time drew close to the deadline again CEO-Office of DEI recruited Project 50 and Swapmeet Justice to apply. Gathering for Justice also applied. By January 5th 2024, a total of five community organizations submitted applications.

The Ad Hoc Committee members met on February 5, 2024 to review all applications and unanimously selected three applicants to invite for interviews: Project50, RISE Simi Valley and Gathering for Justice. Community organizations were selected based on the responses provided in the application, diversity and equitable representation of community groups in PSREAG and Ventura County.

Rise Simi Valley withdrew their application while Project 50 and Gathering for Justice both participated in interviews, conducted on January 19, 2024 and January 30, 2024, respectively. Identical questions were asked of both organizations (see copy of questions below) and in accordance to PSREAG bylaws, the Ad Hoc Committee recommended the top two candidates for final selection to the larger PSREAG for review and discussion. During the February 7, 2024 regular PSREAG meeting the Ad Hoc Committee presented Project 50 and Gathering for Justice for consideration. The item was continued to the March regular meeting agenda for further consideration and an email was sent from CEO-Office of DEI on February 2nd 2024, containing the applications for the two organizations under consideration so that PSREAG members could review the organizations prior to the March 7, 2024 regular PSREAG meeting.

Recommended Actions: The Community Organizational Member Application Review Ad-hoc committee is recommending Gathering for Justice and Project 50 for final consideration and request that a final selection be made by the larger PSREAG body after review and discussion.
