## Linked In Learning Update

In January 2019, our County launched the LinkedIn Learning platform for all its regular employees. The platform allows for employees to access over 9000 courses and videos for their personal and professional

growth. Here are some interesting facts about our progress at the 5 month mark since the launch:

- Twenty-one percent (21%) of our workforce is now using LinkedIn Learning. Almost 2,000 employees have successfully set up their accounts and are now actively learning and growing.
- Over 27,000 videos have been viewed and 806 classes completed, saving the County over \$75,000 in trainer,
- travel and mileage costs! Due to the hundreds of computer software classes on LinkedIn Learning, we are reducing the number of computer classes at Ventura College. LinkedIn Learning content includes MS Excel, Word, Powerpoint and Access in addition to many MS Office 365 classes.
- The most popular classes/videos are:
  - Communication Tips Weekly and Communicating with Confidence Excel 2016 (including pivot tables for beginners)

    - Being an Effective Team Member Extreme Productivity
    - Leading without Formal Authority

# **Cyber Security Reminders from Risk Management**



The computer has become a part of daily life for many of us in the workplace. Email communications are critical to the operation but also a potential route to the County's computer system.

Increased threats from cyber scams, known as phishing, often start with an email link or attachment. In fact, 91% of all cyber attacks start with a phishing email. County computer systems are protected by a host of security measures designed to detect and keep cyber attacks out.

Cyber security studies report that the biggest risk to an entity's computer system is the person at the keyboard, opening the door to a harmful

program. One recent report fallied two-thirds of security compromises were due to clicking on an unexpected link or getting redirected to a malicious website. On June 20, 2019, a news station reported that a Florida city approved payment of the equivalent of \$600,000 in Bit Coins to hackers who were holding city records hostage in a "ransomware" attack. The hack was believed to have been caused by a city worker who clicked on an email link. The cities of Baltimore, Atlanta and Newark have all been victims of similar attacks.

You probably noticed the new banner shown below on many County emails. The purpose of the banner is to remind users that they may well hold the key to the County's computer security walt. Opening and following links from an unknown source can result in uploading malicious software. Distrust suspicious emails. Don't click on links from an email whose source you don't recognize. If there is a question about the email, call the IT Services' Help Desk at (805) 658-4357. And if you receive a suspicious email, heed the warning on the caution banners, and forward it to <u>Spam.Manager@ventura.org</u>. You will receive directions from the Spam Manager within minutes what to do from there. Forwarding the suspicious email allows County Cyber Security Staff to dissect the suspicious package to determine if it is safe or if appropriate security measures are needed.
