1. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers regularly assess their cybersecurity, addressing both IT and SCADA, consistent with EPA and CISA recommended best practice.

Answer:

The Triunfo Water & Sanitation District assumed sole operation of its water, wastewater, and recycled water on July 1, 2022. Triunfo has installed and maintains firewalls for its SCADA infrastructure and utilizes multifactor authentication for all operators to access and modify its SCADA system.

Triunfo Water & Sanitation District has retained a consultant to provide a Vulnerability Assessment for its SCADA system.

2. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers regularly share and exchange information regarding cybersecurity threats, attacks, projections and remedies, and provide training, using such forms as the AWAVC.

Answer:

The Triunfo Water & Sanitation District has not experienced a cybersecurity event and informs its IT vendor, Frontier Technology Inc., of any suspicious activity in a timely manner. Information regarding any potential threats is disseminated by email to all employees. Triunfo will be developing an annual refresher training program for cybersecurity for its employees.

3. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers use free federal and state expert assistance to enhance cybersecurity.

Answer:

Triunfo's IT service provider, Frontier Technology Inc. ensures software upgrades to the latest versions are implemented in a timely manner. Ventura Regional Sanitation District provides contract service for Triunfo's SCADA system and similarly ensures software upgrades for Triunfo's SCADA system are implemented in a timely manner. Triunfo's operators use multi-factor authentication for remote access to the SCADA system. Because Triunfo has only operated as a stand-alone agency since July 2021, most IT systems and software are relatively new. Triunfo will work with its IT vendor, Frontier Technology, Inc. to ensure IT systems are kept up to date and unused software is removed from computers. Trunfo has registered for CISA's Cyber Hygiene Vulnerability Scanning service.

4. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers regularly conduct cybersecurity awareness training.

Answer:

Triunfo Water & Sanitation District will develop and provide an annual cybersecurity refresher training course for its employees by December 31, 2022.

5. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers address recovery from cybersecurity incidents in their business recovery plans.

Triunfo Water & Sanitation District will incorporate recovery from cybersecurity incidents in its business recovery plan by June 30, 2023.

6. The Grand Jury recommends that the investigated public water providers regularly establish a CISA-compliant internal protocol for reporting cyber incidents.

All Triunfo Water & Sanitation, District employees are required to notify Frontier Technology, Inc., by email when there is a potential cyber security incident related to phishing or malware. All cyber security incidents will be reported to CISA/US-CERT as required by the NIST Computer Security Incident Handling Guide.
