Ventura County Public Health is able to receive electronic syndromic surveillance data from local acute care hospitals through EpiCenter. However, we are unable to accept electronic syndromic surveillance data from other provider types. CalREDIE is able to receive electronic laboratory reports which are then transmitted to Ventura County Public Health. Eligible providers will need to sign up to begin testing utilizing the following link: <http://hie.cdph.ca.gov/>.

The California Immunization Registry (CAIR) is able to receive immunization test data. Upon submission of a test message, you will receive a confirmation notice of a successful test message from CAIR. If the CAIR registry is unable to process your test message for any reason, you will be provided with an exclusion notice. Ventura County Public Health is unable to accept electronic data submissions for cancer reporting. For information regarding cancer reporting, go to the California Department of Public Health, Health Information Exchange at <http://hie.cdph.ca.gov/>.

Blood lead testing results must be reported directly to the State and cannot go through local jurisdictions. Once reporting of blood lead tests is operative through the CDPH Gateway, information on registration will be available at <http://hie.cdph.ca.gov/blood-lead.html>.
