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## RE: LICENSED CHILD CARE PROVIDER UPDATE

The Ventura County Public Health (VCPH) Department continues to follow the guidance for COVID-19, based on recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), and the California Occupational Safety and Health Administration (Cal/OSHA).

## Cal/OSHA Revisions to the COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) Pertaining to Licensed Child Care Providers:

- No physical distancing or barrier requirements regardless of employee vaccination status with the following exceptions:
  - Employers must evaluate whether it is necessary to implement physical distancing and barriers during an outbreak (3 or more cases in an exposed group of employees).
- Fully vaccinated employees without symptoms do not need to be tested or quarantined after close contacts with COVID-19 cases unless the exposed employees have symptoms.
- No face covering requirements outdoors (except during outbreaks), regardless of vaccination status, though workers must be trained on CDPH recommendations for outdoor use of face coverings.
- Employers may not retaliate against employees for wearing face coverings.

## CDPH Updates to the COVID-19 Guidance for Child Care Providers and Programs:

The CDPH and CDC strongly recommend vaccination as one of the most important tools to end the COVID-19 pandemic. Licensees and providers are eligible to receive vaccinations at no expense. There are several ways to obtain vaccination. Please see a list of vaccine clinics available in <u>Ventura County</u>. Please see <u>PIN 21-06-CCP</u> for more information on vaccine safety, benefits, and how to get the vaccine.

- Physical Distancing and Stable Groups:
  - Childcare settings typically have a stable group model with the same groups of staff and children
    each day, and licensees and providers should consider continuing to implement stable groups as
    a best practice.
  - Staff should follow Cal/OSHA ETS for physical distancing requirements (see Cal/OSHA revisions above).
- Face covering:
  - Child care providers must ensure compliance with the current <u>CDPH Guidance for the Use of Masks</u>. As of June 15, 2021, the use of face coverings is required by the CDPH and Cal/OSHA in childcare indoor settings regardless of vaccination status.
  - Never place face coverings on babies or children under 2 years of age because it poses a danger and risk for suffocation.
  - Children should not wear face coverings while sleeping.
  - Childcare providers and licensees must ensure the use of face coverings does not cause children to overheat in hot weather.
- Vaccine:
  - If a licensee or provider requests confirmation that a staff or child has received the COVID-19 vaccine, it is recommended the confirmation should be documented in the same way immunizations are documented and maintained in the facility file. Those confirming may review and accept a hard copy or digital record of vaccine receipt.

Please keep in mind if there are differing requirements between the most current CDPH, CCL, Cal/OSHA, and local health department guidance or health orders, licensees and providers should follow the strictest requirements.
