- Dental and other oral Health Clinics
- Public Health High Risk workers and Field Staff

Tier 3

Early January – Late February

- Specialty Clinics
- Surgical Centers
- Laboratory workers
- Pharmacy Staff not working in setting in higher Tiers

Early February – Late March

- Law Enforcement, Firefighters, Corrections Officers, Youth Authority
- Persons aged 75 years or older
- Psychologists and Social Workers

- All other persons 16 years or older and not already recommended for vaccination in Phases 1a, 1b, or 1c



After Phase 2

- Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices is closely monitoring clinical trials in children and adolescents and will consider recommendations for use when a COVID-19 vaccine is authorized for use in persons aged <16 years



- The priority and distribution for the COVID-19 vaccine is in alignment with CDC and CDPH guidelines
- The goal is to vaccinate 70% or more of all Ventura County residents
