WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD

<u>Role</u>

Public board of local leaders from business, labor, education, economic development, government, and community organizations, appointed by the Ventura County Board of Supervisors to...

- ✓ <u>Administer</u> Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title 1 funds.
- Provide <u>oversight</u> for WIOA Title I workforce development programs and services to benefit job seekers, workers, youth and employers.
- Facilitate regional collaboration, alignment, and leveraging of private/public resources to support business workforce needs.

SUCCESS STORY Boys and Girls Club of Greater Oxnard and Port Hueneme



Brenda

High School Graduate and unable to find guidance at home. Brenda decided to enroll in the Out of School Job Readiness Program with Boys and Girls Club of Grater Oxnard and Port Hueneme.

The workshop helped her be more confident and as a result, Brenda successfully enrolled at a community college.

Her efforts paid off, and she was hired at Target and Boys and Girls Cub of Oxnard and Port Hueneme in the After School program.

SUCCESS STORY Pathpoint




Chad had been in the foster care system for the greater part of his life and dropped out of high school. Knowing he would be "aging" out at 21 years old he knew he wanted to get his high school diploma. Chad sought the help of the Youth Network Services program with Pathpoint, funded by WIOA, where he received financial aid to purchase school supplies, clothes, and gas to get to school.

Chad graduated high school and is currently employer.

He plans to enter post-secondary education soon.

Noah


Noah was affiliated with local gangs, and had dropped out of high school. As a result, he was referred to the Youth Networked Services (YNS) with Pathpoint funded by WIOA, to help him get back on track.

After enrolling in the program, he discovered that he had senior credits but needed some encouragement and support to return to school. Noah's YNS specialist helped him with the process, where he was able to enroll in school and receive his high school diploma.

He is currently employed, is now enrolled at Ventura College and soon will be transferring to a four-year university.



SUCCESS STORY Ventura Adult and Continuing Education (VACE)




Griselda

Griselda struggled with speaking and understanding English, and decided to enroll at VACE. With the help of a bilingual case manager under the WIOA program she was able to improve her communication skills.

VACE assisted her with getting employed with a local manufacturing company, where she recently received a promotion and is currently being considered to receive another promotion to a Production Control Assistant.



SUCCESS STORY American Job Center of California (AJCC)



Martha

Martha's position was eliminated due to a company downsizing and as a result, she participated in a Rapid Response event, given by the staff at the American Job Center, where she became familiar with WIOA services.

After enrolling in the WIOA program, she was able to update her office skills, and received individual training.

As a result, Martha was able to secure employment.





✓ Healthcare Committee



- Clinical Lab Scientist (CLS): Completed and received approval for the CLS Field Experience Program Combined State application. Four hospitals collaborated with CSUCI to create a local program to meet workforce needs.
- Healthcare Case Manager Certification: Actively participated in the two-region project with six Los Angeles workforce boards to develop a certification program for high-demand healthcare case managers.
- A.S.N. to B.S.N. Transition: Continued to monitor and explore the Associate Degree Nursing to Bachelor of Science Nursing, transition needs and challenges in the region.



Clean/Green Committee

- <u>Green Business Practices</u>: Formed an Employer Awareness
 Workgroup to develop a green practices message that would raise awareness in the region.
- Water/Wastewater Jobs: Collaborated with the community colleges on a survey to identify the water/wastewater training and job opportunities in the region.



- <u>Labor Apprenticeships</u>: Coordinated with LiUNA to make apprenticeship training accessible through our WIOA Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL).
- Education/Training Inventory: Developed a draft inventory of the clean/green-related education and training programs available through the community colleges, adult schools and labor unions in Ventura County.



Manufacturing Committee



- Manufacturing Career Ladders: Provided employer feedback on the initial VC Innovates draft of the Manufacturing and Engineering Career Pathways Career Ladder Chart. Suggestions related to production, maintenance and facilities, engineering, quality assurance, regulatory affairs, and supply chain positions.
- <u>Manufacturing Curriculum Development</u>: Provided the WDB Manufacturing Readiness Skills list and manufacturing employer feedback to help support the development of a Ventura College curriculum of eight manufacturing-related courses.
- Manufacturing Network Development: Created a quarterly networking event to help engage businesses in MRVC and workforce development. For Manufacturing Day 2016, opened manufacturing doors to more than 300 students.
